

THE greatest party in the world kicked off yesterday, but the everything-goes attitude of the Rio Carnival is under threat.

As celebrities such as Madonna and Beyonce flock to the city, the mayor's year-old zerotolerance campaign against petty crime and disorder was on display, the *Associated Press* reports. Revellers who drink too much and then want to use gutters as toilets will no longer be tolerated, with nearly 100 arrested already for such acts.

Beach football is only allowed after 5pm and greasy food has been banned from the beaches.

However, the most noticeably change is the disappearance of Rio's world-famous waterfront pickup club for legal prostitutes.

Hundreds of prostitutes would gather each night to meet up with an almost exclusively foreign clientele at the notorious Help Disco.
