MINISTER KANCEVSKA-MILEVSKA WORKING VISIT

Museum in Ethno Village in Nerezi - representative of unique Macedonian treasure

“In this house, there are over 150 unique ethnological objects that have not been exposed, many costumes from the 19th and 20th centuries from different regions in Macedonia, exclusive jewellery. In addition to the museum exhibition, in the upper part is a space for various cultural events, conferences, seminars ... The museum is also very visited and although currently working from 10:00 to 18:00 hours, the working time is planned to be extended to 22:00 hours because of high attendance, especially after 19:00, "added Kancevska-Milevska.







The Ethnological Museum which is located within the complex Macedonian ethno village project Nerezi by the Government of The Republic of Macedonia, is truly representative of the country's cultural heritage. As pointed out by the Minister of Culture - Elizabeta Kancevska-Milevska, it is a significant exhibition presented by the Museum of Macedonia in order to put into operation the entire complex, which has a significant cultural and historical dimension.

"Macedonian ethno village Nerezi boasts 12 typical houses that represent architecture in Macedonia, the culture of living in the Macedonian village through various customs and crafts that we can see in every house. You can see a pottery workshop where items are manufactured for the purpose of sale, weaving workshop, a workshop for silver work ... which are traditional crafts typical for the Republic of Macedonia ", says Kancevska-Milevska, who yesterday visited the museum within the Ethno village. She said that since its opening a month ago, Ethno village has been visited by over 20 thousand visitors.

In the complex can be seen houses from Ohrid, Bitola, Krusevo, Kratovo, Galich, Prilep, the architecture of Malesevija ...

The Minister said that staff are employed as curators, guides and experts necessary for the operation of the museum.

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Within the setting are appropriate photos of everyday and holiday costumes, traditional tools and utensils that were used in the manufacture of clothing and fabrics, as well as documentaries from the Cinematheque of Macedonia.

Ethno village with all its contents is an excellent opportunity for all visitors, both domestic and foreign, who can also tap into the capacity of ethno village to learn about the life and traditions of our people is of particular importance for tourism promotion of our country, and which will contribute to economic benefit.

The Director of the Ethno Village, Paul Kamiloski, however, indicated that the total area of the complex is 15,000 square meters with 12 authentic houses and three restaurants, a traditional and international pub. He added that attendance has soared, and visitors are thrilled by what they can see in the complex.
