We are writing you with a quick update of some of our work in the past months, including two international projects related to reducing plastic waste that we announced at the Clinton Global Initiative. These are the <u>Plastic</u> <u>Disclosure Project</u> and Global Alert – Floating Trash, which we are now developing. We appreciate your support on these projects, as the more we can build momentum and awareness of these types of solutions, the more we can make a difference. We believe that these programs can bring about large scale change in the way that we think about plastic as a material and can spur innovation in the ways in which we use it, ultimately increasing efficiency, promoting alternatives, reducing total use, and making sure that it does not find its way into our ecosystem and ocean. <u>Click here and press "Donate to</u> <u>ORA" to support our efforts.</u>

In other projects, the Ocean Recovery Alliance is part of a small team of scientists from the University of Hawaii and Scripps Oceanography that is now tracking part of the eastern edge of the tsunami debris flow (a result of the March 11, 2011 earthquake in Japan) across the Pacific. Information from the drifter buoys that have been placed in this region of the ocean will give authorities valuable information about where and how this debris plume may be moving.
