## **"SMART OCEAN/SMART INDUSTRIES" – LEADERSHIP COMPANIES ADVANCE GLOBAL PROGRAM ON DATA COLLECTION**

#### Special Session at Sustainable Ocean Summit to Focus on Scaling Up Data Collection from Vessels and Platforms

27 March 2013

As part of the Sustainable Ocean Summit (SOS), leading ocean companies are working through the World Ocean Council (WOC) Smart Ocean/Smart Industries program to improve and expand data collection by vessels and offshore structures. Progress and plans for this will be addressed in a special session of the upcoming SOS 2013 to be held from 22-24 April in Washington DC.

The WOC Smart Ocean/Smart Industries initiative, co-chaired by Maersk and Marinexplore, is developing the system to foster, facilitate and coordinate the cost-effective collection of oceanographic and atmospheric data from an expanded number and type of commercial operators.

Increased data can help improve the modeling and forecasting of weather, ocean conditions and climate change, and can support the responsible use of ocean space and resources – all with benefits for business, science, government, and society.

The Smart Ocean/Smart Industries session at SOS 2103 will include:

- The results of an industry survey regarding ocean data collection and sharing.
- A demonstration of real outputs derived from real voluntary data.

- A panel of representatives from shipping, oil and gas, fisheries, marine technology and other sectors to consider the practicalities of data collection from commercial vessels and platforms.
- A multi-industry discussion on the roadmap for moving forward with the program.

The session will address questions of:

- What are the common interests of ocean industries in collaborating to improve science and forecasts that support safe, efficient and responsible ocean use?
- What is needed to scale up the number and kinds of vessels and platforms collecting robust, standardized ocean, weather and climate data?
- How can ocean data software facilitate data sharing and use and support ocean industries in solving challenges of safe and sustainable ocean operations?

Leadership companies interested in being a part of this effort *to better understand the ocean upon which they depend* are invited to the Smart Oceans/Smart Industries session of SOS 2103.
