One Week Internship at UDAAN FOUNDATION

<u>Day 1</u>

Date: 24/05/2022

<u>Time:</u> 9:00 am to 1:00 pm



The first day of internship began at Olympia Basti, where a two hours session - from 9:00 am to 11: am was held for the children residing in that area. The students of batch 1- Prachi Shinde, Hamid Raza and Pratiksha Sawant reported at the venue at 8:45 am and later were guided to Olympia Basti by UDAAN co-ordinator - Mr Shiv Narayan. Mr Shiv Narayan introduced us to the teacher incharge- Ms Sarika and the students. The class consisted of 30 students of ages varying upto 10 years. Mr Shiv told us that the students are taught right from the basics, like alphabets, numbers, etc so as to make their foundation strong and thus prepare them to take admission in schools.

Ms Sarika started the class at 9:10 am. In order to build enthusiasm within the students, Ms Sarika started the class by greeting the students and telling the students to raise their hands and then to jump and sit down. She then revised what was taught to the students on the previous day. Ms Sarika told us that since the students do not know alphabets and numbers, she teaches two alphabets and two numbers each day to the students. The alphabets that were taught on the previous day were S and T. She asked them to name the words that begin with these two letters. The students were naming different words like Sun, Stars, Ship, Tea pot, Tiger, etc. Later, she taught them the next two alphabets i.e U and V. She had drawn both the alphabets. She was teaching them the sound of both the alphabets, so that the students can recognise the alphabets easily. After teaching for one hour, the lecture was then handed over to the volunteers of BTTC to continue with the teaching.

Ms Prachi Shinde and Ms Pratiksha Sawant started revising all the alphabets taught to the students. We asked the students to name the alphabet drawn on the board and to give examples of the words beginning with that alphabet. The students were also asked to recite the numbers from 1-10 and so on. A series of numbers and alphabets were written on the board, with few missing alphabets and numbers within them, the students were raising their hands and answering the missing letters and numbers. Later, the students came forward and recited different poems in front of the class.

After Ms Prachi and Ms Pratiksha, Mr Hamid Raza taught body parts to the students. The students were naming the different parts of the body asked by Mr Hamid. Lastly, the attendance of the students was taken and then all the students left one by one. After completing the two hours session at Olympia Basti, the volunteers of BTTC had to continue their internship at UDAAN Foundation school where the students of ages varying from 12 - 16 years were present. The students were taught Spoken English with the help of different situations given to them and they had to do a 2-3 mins role play in English according to the given situation in front of the class. The students enacted 8-10 role plays in front of the class. The teacher incharge, Mr Hamid and Ms Prachi also helped the students in the enactment of a few role plays. At the end, the teacher gave them homework and thus the class and day 1 of our internship ended.



The second day of internship began at Olympia Basti at 9:00 am. The two hours of session i.e from 9:00 am to 11:00 am was completely given to BTTC volunteers to teach. The session began with morning greetings and some fun warm up exercises to build learning eagerness among students. Mr Hamid Raza started the class by revising the alphabets- U and V, that were taught on the previous day. He then drew the next two alphabets to be taught i.e W and X, along with some words that begin with those alphabets. After teaching the alphabets, the students were asked to write the alphabets in their notebooks. Ms Sarika and the BTTC volunteers helped the students who were unable to write the alphabets on their own.

After a short 2 minutes break, Ms Pratiksha continued the session by teaching numbers to the students. She taught the numbers - 18 and 19 to the students by drawing them on the board along with some pictures of fruits. The students counted the number of fruits drawn on the board, which helped them to understand the numbers 18 and 19 easily. Ms Pratiksha then called a few students to come forward and write the numbers on the board. The students who were having some difficulty in writing the numbers on the board were guided by Ms Pratiksha and Ms Sarika.

Later, Ms Prachi continued the session by teaching the poem- "Johny Johny" to the students. She started by making the students do some basic stretching exercises so as to enhance their energy level and maintain their concentration. Shen then made the students repeat the poem after her and then taught the actions to be performed while reciting the poem. Once the students were well versed with the poem, they were called in groups to recite the poem in front of the whole class. The session ended with a beautiful story narrated by Ms Sarika.

The BTTC volunteers then headed towards UDAAN Foundation school to continue their internship over there. In the beginning, the students were taught how to respond to interview questions in english. After that, the class was divided into four groups to perform an activity. Different pictures were displayed on the screen one by one and each group had to discuss among themselves and describe the picture in their own words by writing the discussed points in their notebooks. The students were given a time limit of 7 minutes to discuss and describe the picture and then present what they had written in front of the whole class. This activity helped the students to enhance their thinking and sentence formation skills. Each group presented one by one and they were given points on the structure, grammar and the content they had written. Lastly, the winners of the activity were announced and thus the second day of internship ended on a positive note.

<u>Day 3</u>

Date: 26/05/2022

<u>Time:</u> 9:00 am to 1:00 pm



The third day of internship began at Olympia Basti at 9:00 am. Ms Sarika began the session in her usual way i.e by doing some warm up exercises. She then did an activity with the students - Match the columns, where the students had to count different shapes and match it to the numbers written in the other column. After the activity, Mr Hamid continued the class. He first revised the poem - Johny Johny which was taught on the previous day. He then taught the alphabets Y and Z by drawing the alphabets and different words beginning with those alphabets on the board. After a 2 minutes break, Mr Hamid taught the number "20" to the students and did a quick revision of all the numbers i.e from 1 to 20. Later, the BTTC volunteers headed towards UDAAN Foundation School, where Mr Hamid and Ms Pratiksha taught Parts of Speech to the students. Ms Pratiksha taught nouns to the students and the remaining Parts of Speech topic was taught by Mr Hamid. He also completed a module -Telephonic conversation, which helped the students to understand how to have basic communication skills over telephone. The students enjoyed the session and thus day 3 of our internship came to an end.

<u>Day 4</u>

Date: 27/05/2022





The volunteers of BTTC reported at 9:00 am at Olympia basti on day 4 of internship. The volunteers were informed that the students of the basti have to do a presentation of whatever they have learnt till now on 31st May in front of Ms Sushree- the director of UDAAN Foundation and other incharges of UDAAN. Thus, the 2 hours at Olympia Basti were utilized to prepare the students for the presentation. In order to show the counting skills of the students, the numbers 1-10 were written on paper cups, the students had to come one by one in front of the table on which the cups were placed and then count the number of chalk pieces kept on the table and thus accordingly select the paper cup representing the number of chalk pieces. Few students were unable to recognize the correct paper cup and hence their names were noted down, so as to pay more attention to their practice.

Later, another activity was performed where various pluck cards of the alphabets A-Z and images of different words were shown to the students. The students had to recognize the alphabets and the words shown to them. Along with these activities, revision of the alphabets A-Z in writing, poem-Johnny Johnny and Twinkle Twinkle little stars was also done. Lastly, Mr Hamid told the story of "The thirty crow" to the students.

From 11:00am - 1:00 pm the students at UDAAN Foundation school had a session on soft skills. This session helped the students to enhance their skills of public speaking, critical thinking and problem solving. Thus, day 4 on internship ended on a very positive note.

<u>Day 5</u>

Date: 28/05/2022

<u>Time:</u> 9:00 am to 1:00 pm



The fifth day of internship began at Olympia basti at 9:00 am. The volunteers of BTTC had to help the teacher incharge - Ms Sarika for the presentation to be shown on 31st May, 2022. Students were to be sorted for different activities of the presentation. For the first activity i.e number game, three students were selected. The students had to count the different articles placed in front of them and then place a cup (cups ranging from 1-10 were placed at the side) denoting the count of those objects. For the second activity, a chart of alphabets A-Z was placed in front of the students. The students had to pick a chit from the bowl, recognize the drawing made on the chit and then place it accordingly in front of an alphabet. For example: A chit having the drawing of an apple will be placed on the alphabet A in the chart. Later in the last activity, Ms Sarika had written a few alphabets and numbers.

During the short break, the children had fun playing hopscotch and blindfold catch. After the break, Mr Shiv Narayan taught poems and stories to the students. Later, Mr Hamid and Ms Prachi headed towards UDAAN Foundation school for the 11:00am - 1:00pm session. At the school, Ms Pratiksha started the session by introducing tenses to the students. She explained the three types of tenses and the meaning of action verbs. After that, Mr Hamid and Ms Prachi continued the session. Mr Hamid taught the simple and continuous forms of all three tenses. Ms Prachi drew a chart on the board relating to the explanation done by Mr Hamid. The students were given various real life examples to understand the different tenses. Lastly, the students drew the chart in their notebook and thus the session ended.
